## Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

A Model Constitution for a registered charity in Scotland was prepared by Aberdeen Council for Voluntary Organisation (ACVO), the third sector interface in Aberdeen and this was approved by OSCR in December 2017 with a maximum of ten trustees to comprise the Board of Trustees

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The advancement of citizenship and community development, the provision of recreational facilities and the organisation of recreational activities with the object of improving the conditions of life of the inhabitants of Torry and its surroundings in the City of Aberdeen and in furterene of this by; carrying out the undertakings associated with the provision of a Community Centre in the Torry area of Aberdeen.

## **Achievements and performance**

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

OTCC in numbers

2022 was the first full year since the pandemic ended, however, we appreciated that COVID-19 was still a reality of life and have maintained a range of measures that includes maintaining good ventilation standards, hand hygiene and the supply of PPE for optional use. We also recognised that one impact of COVID was to create a sense of uncertainty in the presence of numbers and always welcome folk to the Centre whether for the first time or as someone returning, accepting that a build-up of both activities and attendance would take time. We cater for some of the youngest and oldest in our activities and look to broaden activities within the times available each day and evening.

Across a seven-day week we now welcome some 200 folk to participate in activities, some lead by qualified tutors and others by a lead volunteer. Our Centre programme is presented on our website, and we use social media to broaden the reach and support for the Centre. We have fully appreciated the hardships faced by so many in uncertain times from the cost of living and energy prices in a period of high inflation and have sought to maintain our cost of entry low so as to minimise any barriers to participation in activities.

### Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Our current policy is to ring fence a sum that is sufficient to cover operating costs for a period of six months. We also have a sum reserved for unforeseen costs for a replacement gas boiler and for repairs/improvements that are linked to improving facilities and the appearance of the Centre.

Details of any deficit

Donated facilities and services (if any)

There are no deficits on any funds as of 31st December 2022

The Trustees agreed to gift the use of the Centre at no cost to RGU Physio outreach to enable a vitally needed local exercise clinic to begin under the supervision of their qualified tutors. We also agreed to gift the use of the Centre to Ten Feet Tall Theatre Company for the development of artistic and acting skills in a hard-to-reach community with little disposal income to pay for tuition

# Other optional information

### Partnership Collaboration.

We have continued and extended our collaboration with other third sectors organisations that includes Pathways, Lead Scotland, Aberdeen Foyer and TLC, working on behalf of the Trussell Trust.

We record our appreciation to Aberdeen City Council for their package of financial support that includes a development grant and assists us in undertaking innovative activities and developing new initiatives that can be presented by the Centre thereby preventing the cost of access being a barrier to inclusion.

A new start in 2022 was inviting Robert Gordon University to outreach a physio session for over-55s that would offer advice linked to movements and exercise regimes in a friendly social setting. In 2023, this outreach now includes two sessions in one morning to allow for greater capacity in attendance.

#### Volunteers

Since the pandemic, we have begun to rebuild a pool of volunteers to support the Centre. We greatly appreciate their gift of time to the Centre and are working with ACVO to create a package of support and mentoring opportunities.
